## SMALLER FAMILIES ▼

**3.4** persons per household in 2015  
(3.5 in 2010)



## FEWER BABIES ▼

**2.14** children born to each married woman\*  
(2.24 in 2010)



## BOTH WORKING ▲

**53.8** per cent of married couples are dual-income couples  
(47.1 per cent in 2010)



## YOUNG AND SINGLE ▲

**63** per cent of women and  
(54 per cent in 2010)



**80.2** per cent of men aged between 25 and 29 have never married  
(74.6 per cent in 2010)



## MORE ELDERLY HOUSEHOLDS ▲

**32.2** per cent of people aged 65 and older either live alone, or with just their spouse  
(27.6 per cent in 2010)



## MORE LIVING IN CONDOS ▲

**13.9** per cent of households live in private condominiums  
(11.5 per cent in 2010)

## BETTER EDUCATED ▲

**52** per cent of people aged 25 and older have at least post-secondary qualifications  
(46.5 per cent in 2010)

## ENGLISH SPOKEN AT HOME ▲

**36.9** per cent of people who are aged five and older speak English most often at home.  
(32.3 per cent in 2010)

## RELIGION ▲

**18.5** per cent of those aged 15 and older say they have no religion  
(17 per cent in 2010)

## PUBLIC TRANSPORT PREFERRED ▲

**58.7** per cent of working people take either the public bus, MRT or a combination of both to work  
(54.6 per cent in 2010)
