

Chance of winning

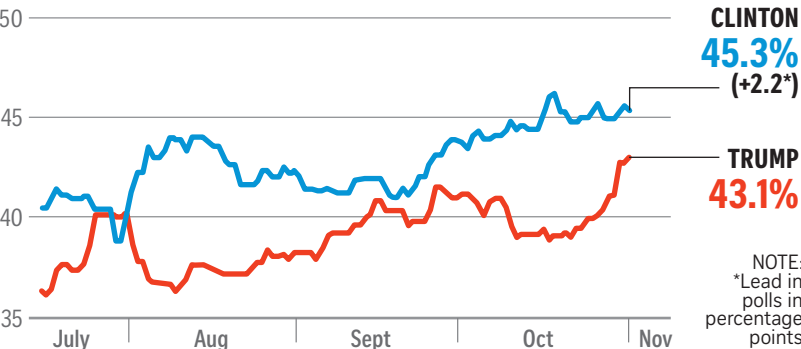
(The New York Times derives the probability from the voting history of each state, as well as state and national polls conducted since mid-April. Figures as of yesterday.)
