

Covid-19: Airlines ground flights

From low-cost carriers to international heavyweights, airlines around the world are cutting flights in the face of tighter border controls and a fall in demand.

OUT OF 127 AIRLINES:



48 airlines

have cut their capacity by 100 per cent, including **Jetstar Asia and HK Express.**



39 airlines

have cut their capacity by 75 per cent to 99 per cent, including **Emirates, Lufthansa Group and Singapore Airlines (SIA)**, together with its subsidiaries **SilkAir and Scoot.**



22 airlines

have cut their capacity by 50 per cent to 75 per cent, including **Qatar Airways, Virgin Australia and United Airlines.**



18 airlines

have cut their capacity by up to 50 per cent, including **Southwest Airlines, Malaysia Airlines and Japan Airlines.**



SIA and its subsidiary SilkAir have grounded

138 planes

out of a combined fleet of 147, while SIA's low-cost subsidiary Scoot has grounded 47 out of 49 planes in its fleet.

Jetstar Asia has grounded its entire fleet of 18 Airbus 320s.
