It is hard to imagine that a seasoned performer like Melanie Chisolm (above), or Sporty Spice as she is better known, had to wrestle with identity and self-acceptance issues.

"Shadows eat me up," she sings on Here I Am, a track from her latest record.


"But I'm no longer scared of the dark, I see the light," she adds, proving that 21 years since her solo debut Northern Star, music is still her guiding light.

And eight solo albums later, the 46-year-old singer is brimming with confidence, declaring on opening track Who I Am: "When I look in the mirror, I finally like what I see."

In recent years, Chisolm has also picked up deejaying - she showed off her skills at a Formula One after-party in Singapore last year - and the electronic influences are apparent in the new album.

The pulsing beats of Blame It On Me and the flirty club banger In And Out Of Love keep her in step with current pop stars like Dua Lipa and Carly Rae Jepsen.

But tracks like Good Enough and the introspective Nowhere To Run remind fans the record is a musical diary of self-reflection.
