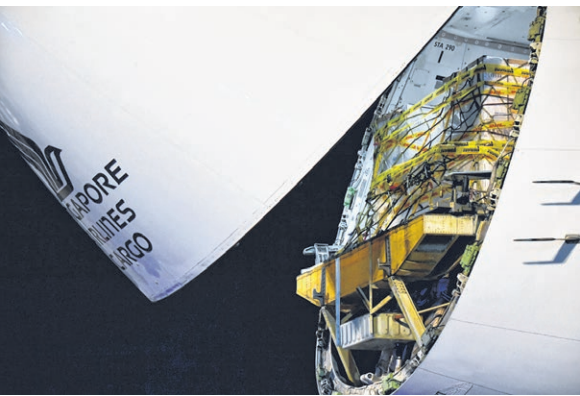


Singapore's vaccination journey

Dec 21 First batch of Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines touches down from Brussels.



Dec 30 Vaccination exercise kicks off with 40 staff from the National Centre for Infectious Diseases getting their jobs.

Jan 8 Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong receives his first dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine at Singapore General Hospital.

Jan 14 Singapore Armed Forces personnel start receiving their jobs.


Jan 18 Mass exercise to vaccinate 37,000 front-line workers in the aviation and maritime sectors begins.

Jan 25 Land transport workers start receiving vaccines, with employees of bus and train operators among those first in line.

Jan 27 Vaccine pilot for seniors begins in Tanjong Pagar and Ang Mo Kio.

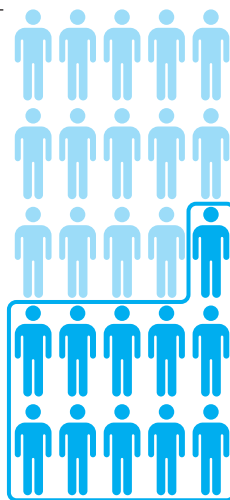
Feb 17 First batch of Moderna vaccines arrives.

Feb 19

 = 10,000 people

About **250,000** residents have received Pfizer-BioNTech shots.

Of those, about **110,000** have had their second dose.



 **11** vaccination centres are in operation.

 Invitation letters are being sent to **seniors aged 70 and above.**

 **5,000** seniors have been vaccinated so far from the pilot projects in Tanjong Pagar and Ang Mo Kio.

Feb 22 Seniors islandwide will begin receiving their jobs.

End-February Another three vaccination centres will open, bringing the total number to 14.

Mid-March

- Each town will have at least one vaccination centre, with over 30 centres in total.
- Invitation letters to seniors aged 60 to 69 will be sent out.

April

- Around 1.25 million people will have had at least the first dose of the vaccine.
- About 40 vaccination centres will be operational.
- Vaccinations will start for the general public.
